

Tonya Hamilton was appointed as Director of the Governor's Office of Youth, Faith and Family (GOYFF) in January 2023. Previous to Ms. Hamilton's appointment, the native Phoenician served 28 years working for the State of Arizona and its citizens at the Pima County Juvenile Court Center, the Arizona Supreme Court, and the Arizona Department of Corrections, Rehabilitation, and Reentry. Hamilton also currently serves as an ex officio member of the Arizona Commission of African American Affairs, a member of the Arizona Human Trafficking Council, and has participated on the Governor's Veterans Policy Academy Team.



Jill Sears serves as the AmeriCorps Mountain Regional Administrator. She began her career in the private sector of risk management. After five years, she followed her interest in service and joined the Peace Corps, serving in Botswana. Ms. Sears joined AmeriCorps in 2010 and has worked for the agency serving in various roles until being named as Deputy Mountain Regional Administrator. Ms. Sears earned a master's degree from Arizona State University and hails from the state of Michigan



Kate Gallego serves as the City of Phoenix Mayor. Mayor Gallego is the second elected female mayor in Phoenix's history and one of the youngest big city mayors in the United States. She was elected to the Phoenix City Council in 2013, representing south Phoenix and the city's downtown core. Prior professional pursuits include strategic planning and economic development for one of Arizona's largest utility companies and service in state government, as part of the governor's team.



Ariel Baber is the Volunteer Manager at AZCEND, working to catalyze the strengths of the local community to combat human services crises in the East Valley. She is a Public Allies Arizona AmeriCorps Alumni, a Leading for Change Fellow, a member of the Big Brothers Big Sisters Young Professionals Council, and a participant in the New Politics Leadership Academy's Answering the Call 2021 Cohort. Ariel holds a bachelor's in Mathematics and Biological Sciences from Arizona State University, and a master's in Public Health from Southern New Hampshire University.


