This is an opportunity to not only raise public awareness of the upcoming 250th but also to set the message we want the public to understand about how we'll mark the commemorations: it's not about history just for history's sake; it's about reminding people what it was all for in the first place and how we're called to continue creating that "more perfect union" each and every day, together.

- "Mobile Museum" statewide tour highlighting Arizona's history within the greater national story
- Opportunity for corporate partnerships
- Tour the Liberty Bell replica currently housed at the State Capitol
- Install a new ceremonial base for the bell
 - Include a 50 and 100-year time capsule
 - Collect items from each community as the museum travels

- Hike250: 250 miles of trails
- Treasures250: List of 250 places to visit in Arizona
 - Parks, natural wonders, historical sites & museums, and more
- Dine250: Unique Arizona eateries
- Cheers250: Statewide Arizona Beer,
 Wine & Spirits Tour with special editions
 - Opportunity to partner with the Department of Transportation and ride sharing companies to highlight a safe driving message



Arizona America 250 Passport



- Check-In App and/or a physical passport with prizes upon different levels of completion
 - 5, 25, 50, 75...
 - Visits from any category count
 - Overall winner or winners to receive "Arizona's Field Trip"
- To consider: Read250, Register250, Kids250, Commemorate250, ADAaccessible sites

Service250

- Individual hours of Civic Engagement and Community Service
 - Similar to the passport app concept, hours would be logged for recognition (name or organization on our website, prizes, drawings, etc)
- Commission could become authorized to bestow the President's Volunteer Service Award
- Grants available from national organizations to support service projects, civics education, training, and youth leadership
- Opportunities for collaboration with Youth Service America



Saguaros250

Inspired by the 1999 "Cow Parade," touted as the world's largest public art event

Local artists decorate fiberglass sculptures, distributed throughout public places such as city buildings, major avenues, and parks

A way to feature local culture and a community's unique flair

Artists could participate individually and/or companies/entities could sponsor
