The CEASE Cities training is available to all city government employees statewide at no cost. Available in-person, via webinar, or on demand through our learning management system. Cities who train at least 75% of their municipal staff receive the CEASE Cities Designation.

CEASE Cities Designation Process

CEASE is pleased to provide training on human trafficking for city employees at all levels.

Specialized training is available for applicable departments.

CEASE Designations are awarded to cities who train a minimum of 75% of municipal staff.

This is a requirement to keep your CEASE Designation each year.
