



Henry's face lights up when his four year old sister runs up the walkway. Living in separate placements, his CASA has brought her to play.

His sister loved the sensory play at the museum but Henry couldn't stop talking about the pumpkin patch he visited.

As the siblings are reunified with their family, the CASA shares the lessons learned with fellow CASAs and prepares to meet another child who needs her advocacy.

17 year old Alex found his placement at a group home challenging and discouraging. To help this youth cope, his CASA volunteer was there on the phone, online and in person to lift spirits.

Trips to Chipotle and being able to try on clothes at Target helped him feel "normal". His CASA encouraged him to try music and hiking and found the supporting agencies for these resources.

Acting annoyed, but secretly grateful he watches his CASA monitor his school progress and talk about housing, laundry and where to turn for help as he moves closer to aging out of foster care.

We Are a Voice for Children.

Each year, thousands of children are removed from their home due to abuse or neglect. Many of these children become lost in the child welfare system, moving from one temporary home to another. A Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) speaks up for the best interests of a child who has experienced abuse or neglect to ensure he or she has a safe, loving and permanent home.

As a CASA volunteer, you become part of a national, volunteer-powered network of committed individuals from all walks of life who believe that every child has the right to be treated with dignity, to be safe, to have a promising future, and to thrive in the embrace of a loving family.

Our Programs

CASA Support

VOICES supports CASA of Maricopa County with CASA volunteer recruitment and resources for volunteers.

CASA Child Enrichment

VOICES supports volunteers and their CASA youth by providing positive experiences and resources. Gifts, blankets, books and specialized services enhance a young person's well-being and provide a sense of comfort and normality during their time in foster care.

Child Welfare Advocacy

Throughout Arizona, VOICES promotes the value of a CASA in a child's life and the rewards it achieves through continual advocacy. Joining with notable child welfare leaders in Arizona, VOICES seeks to continually take on the challenges facing Arizona's children, families and child welfare stakeholders.

Advocate.

CASA is the only organization that empowers everyday citizens as appointed officers of the court who recommend the best possible outcome for a child's future.

Listen.

CASA volunteers get to know the children and seek feedback from everyone in the child's life – relatives, foster parents, teachers, social workers, etc. Volunteers use this information to inform judges and others of what the child most needs.

Speak up.

Volunteers are persistent in ensuring the children's educational, social, physical and mental health needs are met. Judges rely heavily on the volunteer's written court reports to make an informed decision for the child's future.

Everyday hero.

CASA volunteers come from a variety of educational and professional backgrounds with a desire to help children who have experienced abuse or neglect. Volunteers receive extensive training and comprehensive support from professional CASA program staff to assist in each case.
